

## CURRENT LANGUAGE

### SECTION 1. CLASSES OF MEMBERSHIP

- A. Organizational Membership: Any public or private organization, public or private agency or department of government active or interested in the health, welfare, education, recreation, and related issues of Senior Citizens and in agreement with objectives contained in Article III may become a member upon approval by The Board of Directors (herein “the Board”) and payment of a membership fee. Each organization shall designate in writing annually one representative and an alternate to represent the interests of the organization at the meetings. Said representative and alternate must meet the requirements of individual membership.
- B. Individual Membership: Any person, age 50 or older who is interested in the health, welfare, education, recreation, and related issues of Senior Citizens and in agreement with the objectives in Article III may become a member upon payment of any membership fee established by the Board and must pay annual dues to maintain membership.

SECTION 2. VOTING RIGHTS OF MEMBERS: Each Organizational Member and Individual Member (herein collectively “Member(s)”) shall be entitled to a single vote. No Organizational Member shall represent more than one organization. If a person representing an organization also holds an individual membership, that person shall have two votes, one in each capacity.

## PROPOSED CHANGE:

- A. Organizational Membership: Any public or private organization, public or private agency or department of government active or interested in the health, welfare, education, recreation, and related issues of Senior Citizens and in agreement with objectives contained in Article III may become a member upon approval by The Board of Directors (herein “the Board”) and payment of a membership fee. - B. - C. Special Membership: The Board of Directors recognizes that there are adult individuals between the ages of 18 and 49 that have special talents and skills that can successfully assist the organization with its mission and goals. The Board agrees that these individuals will add value as a Board member or a committee member. Any person between the ages of 18 and 49, for purposes of being on the Board of Directors or a committee, who is who is interested in the health, welfare, education, recreation, and related issues of Senior Citizens and in agreement with the objectives in Article III may become a special member upon approval of the Board and upon payment of any membership fee established by the Board and must pay annual dues to maintain membership. Furthermore, no special member(s) may make up more than 49% of the Board of Directors or of a committee.
- D. SECTION 2. VOTING RIGHTS OF MEMBERS: Each Organizational Member, Individual Member, and Special Member (herein collectively “Member(s)”) shall be entitled to a single vote. No Organizational Member shall represent more than one organization. If a person representing an organization also holds an individual membership, that person shall have two votes, one in each capacity.
